

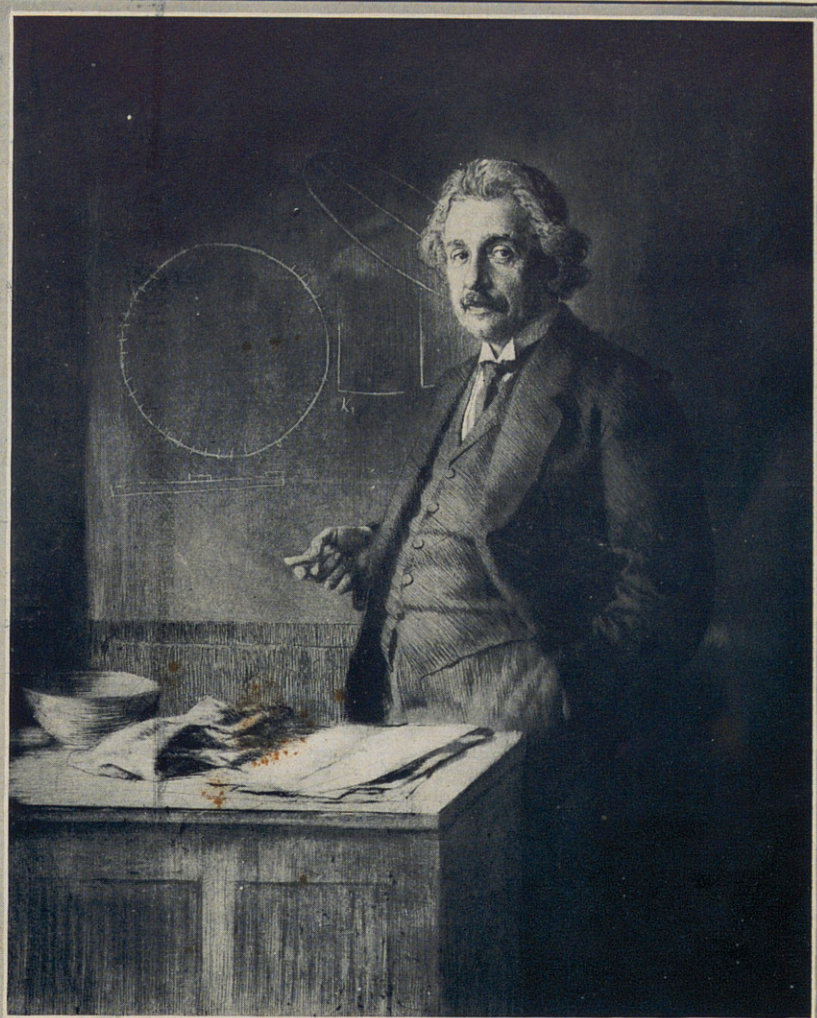

Great European Contemporaries Drawn by a Talented Austrian Artist



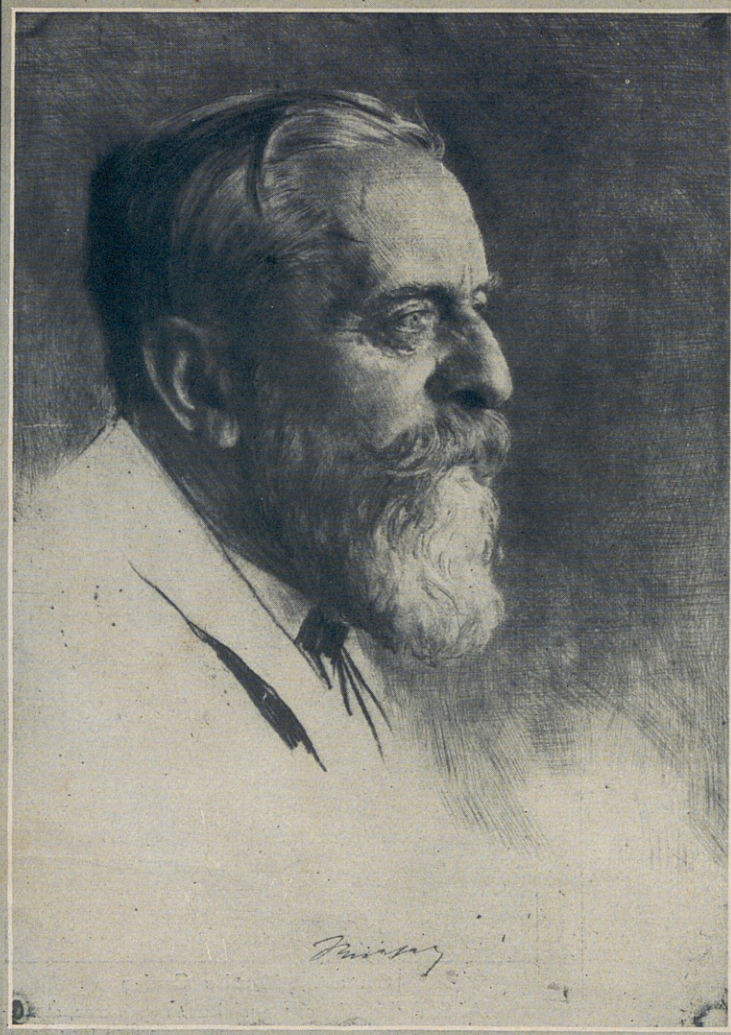
Pablo Casals, 'Cellist and Symphony Composer

Einstein, the famous mathematician whose discovery of Relativity is considered the most important scientific event of our times. He has lectured in this country



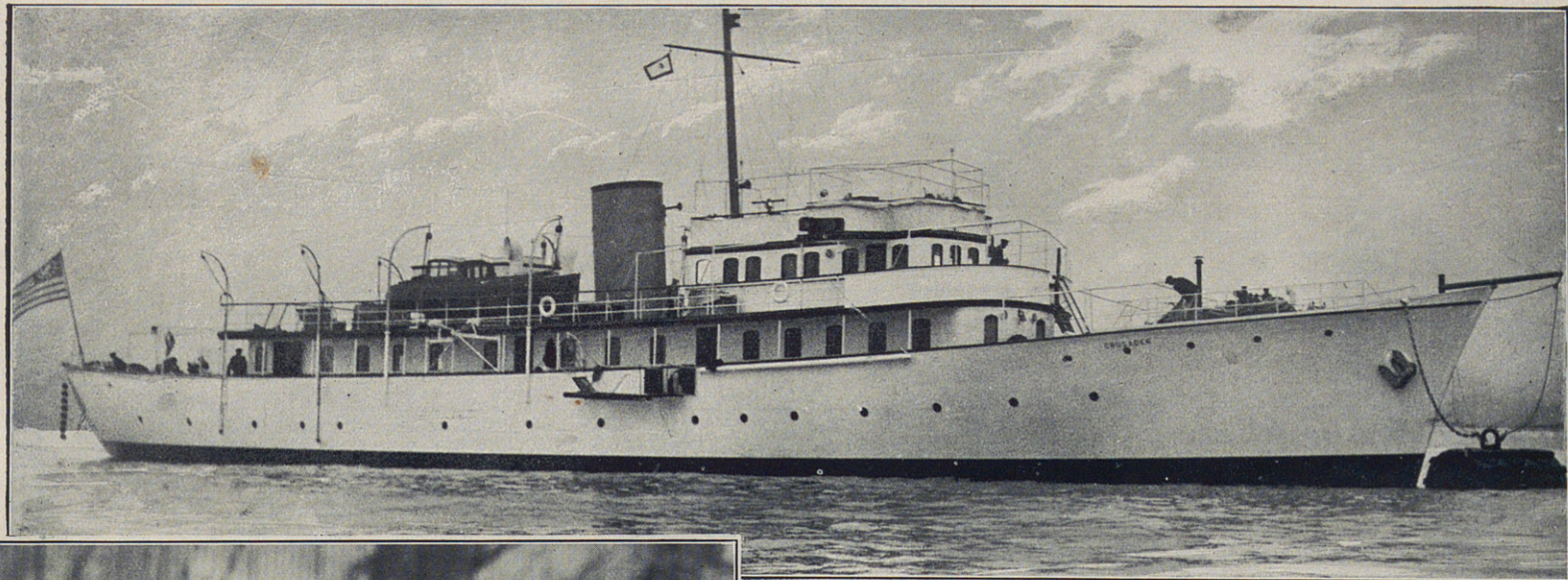
Professor Wieser: An Eminent Economist

The names of Einstein, the mathematician, and Strauss, the composer, are household words in England, which honours them as much as their own countries do; for Professor Einstein was the first "ex-enemy" savant to lecture in this country after the war, and Dr. Strauss was one of the first "ex-enemy" musicians to appear in London. The former's theory of Relativity, though as little understood as it is well known, has now been proved to the satisfaction of scientists and mathematicians.
